

SYNOPSIS

The film opens with a glimpse into the past. 1990s, three little sisters, sit in a line on the couch all dressed up in their Sunday best. They sit stock-still waiting in fear. This flashback returns throughout the story and reveals more and more about the reason behind their fear as the film unravels. Their father John is an aggressive alcoholic and their mother Barbara is obsessed with upholding the 'image' of a perfect life even at the cost of burying her and her daughters' natural feelings and deep-running anxieties.

The three sisters Vicky, Charlotte and Pippa are all grown up. Pippa is overwhelmed by life, she can't cope and depression takes a hold of her. When she attempts to commit suicide, she is admitted to a mental institution. Her fight against this invisible illness is the catalyst for her sisters and mother to face their own demons of anger, blame and stoic denialism, eventually driving them to make changes and amends for their past mistakes and exorcise their unhealed emotional trauma.

Pippa returns to her family life for the sake of her kids and family, but the illness is only dormant. Despite her family progressing significantly in healing their deep emotional wounds, Pippa loses her fight and ends her life.

In this carefully crafted character study the audience gets to go on a journey with the three sisters and their families battling their demons, helping each other, and fighting for love to prevail against all odds. This universal story of family, love and forgiveness is but an attentive exploration into what comes along the way in life and how each of us cope with the troubles thrown at us in our own, very unique way.

The central theme of this story is mental health, which is finally becoming a topic taken seriously in today's conversation and it is a thought-provoking, tear-jerking ride of beautifully crafted exploration into the topic, holding the hands of a family we deeply care about. It is told very reminiscent to European cinematic-style, nonetheless speaking directly to a British, as well as an international audience. The story-telling and voice is very much evocative of European quality family dramas. Xavier Dolen's films immediately spring to mind when looking for tonal and cinematic comps.



In our opinion, the audience is female-skewed, and two-folded. There is the group who'll appreciate the film for the style and cinematic quality, more of the Guardian sort of readers, driven by reviewers and calibre. And there are those who seek answers to lighten their burdens, who dive into the unknown for answers, be that the traditional or the uncharted path - and there are more and more of those. 



Writer-Director-Producer: Marie Delanote


Leo Gregory (Actor)

WRITER - DIRECTOR STATEMENT

'Gripping, Sad and an Eye-opener', were the words used by a reader, that I, as the writer aimed to convey by telling this story. The events depicted in this film are based around the true story experienced by someone very close to me; this is a project of passion, expression and laying the truth bare.

Imbedded, recycled family trauma leading to mental health issues (obvious or hidden) is a fractured foundation for ongoing relationships and marriage; this is a continuous cycle seen across not just this country but the world we live in today.

Despite advances in mental health care many depression related treatments date back to the Victorian era such as isolation and electroshock treatment. Whilst great advances have been made, the experiences and results I have seen close up still do not address some of the fundamental challenges faced by many people who get institutionalised. Professionals react with exterior methods in order to heal something which can only heal from within.

Experiencing the effects of severe depression from so close made me think deeply about what we can do to avoid this. Through this film, I want to open a window and show the world how we can do things differently. It is so important to start doing things differently. Actions, not words, are the best teacher. Forgiveness, love and hope. Four different women, the same trauma but all dealing with it differently. As the writer-director, I aim passionate to shed light on the human mind and emotions and bring it up close to a wider audience.
